Wherever you're at, March is a busy time with dueling expos, fundraisers, habitat projects, and many other events as you'll see below. Volunteer, lend a hand or make a donation, our member organizations are doing a lot of great work and need your involvement.

AZSFWC is also growing! Year to date the Valley of the Sun Quail Forever and the AZ Shooting Sports Education Foundation have joined us, and by the end of this month, Kahuna's Kids and the AZ Taxidermy Association will have become members. American Precision Targets joined as an Affiliate member and this past month, the Outdoorsman's has done the same. We now have 32 Member groups and 3 Affiliates supporting our efforts. If you know of a an outdoor organization that should be a member, have them contact us. In the coming weeks, watch for news on how you can support us as an Individual AZSFWC member too!

On the license plate front, 2017 is shaping up as another record breaking year. Last month we awarded \$32,461 in grants for our first quarter cycle. At the same time, our license plate income has increased approximately \$1500 more per month for the first two months of this year compared to last. Go to www.servicearizona.com to get yours!

### On the Federal Front...

-the National Park Service is still studying what to do about the Grand Canyon bison. We remain hopeful that our new Secretary of the Interior will inspire them to work with our AZ Game & Fish Department and let sportsmen volunteers save the habitat from destruction.

-the BLM continues to spend Millions on burros. Here too we are hopeful some sense comes to this entire matter to save our Sonoran Desert from these feral consumers. We have weighed in on the Sonoran Desert National Monument with a recommendation to keep the entire Monument open to recreational shooting. We will also be commenting on the Safford office's landscape management efforts.

-our National Forests continue to stay busy studying, evaluating and assessing too. We have commented on the Prescott's Chino Valley Landscape Restoration plan, the Tonto's plans and will be for the Kaibab's Wetland habitat enhancement projects.

### On the State Level...

-Senator Farley's bill SB 1182 to ban mountain lion and bobcat hunting died in

committee. The Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) isn't dead however, so this matter remains on our radar.

-Governor Ducey signed HB 2404 into law, mandating some signature gathering changes for ballot initiatives. This bill will make it more difficult to get some matters on the ballot, but likely won't curtail well funded groups like the HSUS.

-Senator Gail Griffin put forth a Resolution supporting hunting and fishing, SCM 1004, and we thank her for that effort!

# **REACHING NEW HEIGHTS**

On January 20, 2011, Sergeant Linville was struck by a tertiary device. The explosion inflicted multiple injuries on Sergeant Linville, some visible others not. Sergeant Linville suffered fractures to his right foot including his cuboid, calcaneus, and two outer metatarsals, in addition to fractures sustained in his right middle finger, and amputation of his right ring finger. Once Charlie was flown out of Afghanistan and finally reached his destination at Balboa Naval Hospital where he received multiple surgeries on his hand and foot and had undergone multiple experimental surgeries in order to walk again. Charlie lost his foot to a below the knee amputation.





In the spring of 2014, he agreed to climb Mt. Everest with The Heroes Project. The climb was halted in April 2014 after 16 Sherpas lost their lives in an avalanche and again on their second attempt in April 2015 after the earthquake in Nepal.

On May 19, 2016, Charlie completed the last of The Seven Summits, and became first combat-wounded veteran to reach the top of Mt. Everest.
