# Final Report To Arizona Sportsmen For Wildlife Conservation

# \$1,775 Grant to 8th Annual Native and Wild Trout Conference April 27, 2017

The 8th Annual Native and Wild Trout Conference was deemed to be another success with a record 138 registrations representing over 30 different conservation organizations, state and federal agencies.

The annual event has grown from 42 attendees in 2010 to over 100+ in the past several years representing a variety of conservation organizations, state and federal agencies.

This year Chris Wood, CEO of Trout Unlimited, was the keynote speaker. Fourteen presentations from various conservation organizations and governmental agencies addressed topics such as the protection of wildlife from the challenges of climate change and forest fires, stream monitoring programs, native and wild trout restorations and collaborations with the Trout Unlimited Southwest Native Trout Strategy (see attached agenda).

Two conservation awards were instituted in 2014 to honor an organization (Apache Award) and an individual (Gila Trout) "for their dedication to the conservation, protection and restoration of native and wild trout" continued with much sentiment.

The 2017 Apache Trout Award was presented to the White Mountain Lakes Foundation (<a href="www.wmlf.org">www.wmlf.org</a>). The Foundation is dedicated to improving the White Mountain fisheries through grassroots conservation, restoration and protection efforts.

Gila Trout Awards were presented to Jim Brooks and Dave Probst. Both individuals were recognized for their many years of work with the Gila trout recovery programs in Arizona and New Mexico including the public education and protection of the Gila trout through partnerships with numerous conservation organizations, state and federal agencies.




