Summarize Project Accomplishments: The ADA provided a mentored hunting camp for 60 youth hunters and their siblings, offering support in locating, harvesting, game care. We had 10 experienced and seasoned mentors who went afield with tag holders to help them harvest and field dress their animal. We emphasized hunter education, safety, ethics, hunting and glassing skills, and provide a hands on

experience throughout the camp for all tag holders, their siblings, family, and hunting party. We conducted seven educational seminars, called 'table clinics' during the midday to those in camp on the topics of: glassing, scouting, map reading and compass use, first aid and survival, food and

nutrition, gun and field safety.

We provided hot breakfast, lunch, dinner and snacks to all of the youth hunters and their entourage free of charge from dinner time Thursday 10/10/2019 through breakfast time on Sunday 10/14/2019, and we served over 800 meals, both hot and cold. We had campfire stories each evening and plenty of activities for non-tag holders each day and evening.

We also provided each of the 60 youth hunters a free, annual ADA youth membership.


