We have eagles, hawks, owls, and falcons that support the educational experience for participants. With the lifting of covid restrictions we put the outreach program into high gear. We set setting up programs all over the state. We strived to have 2 shows month. We participated in small events like campground presentations to larger shows like the Payson Rode We were able to reach a wide variety of people. The ARC is responsible for education materials, providing one more falconers to deliver the education program and manage the raptors. ARC is also responsible for caring for the raptors used in education programs including food, shelter, flight exercise, cages and all sorts of falconry equipment used to manage the raptors for educational purposes. ARC transports our raptors to each educational event. The raptors used in our educational events are often the main attraction drawing the public in to talk with us about raptors, the environment and conservation. At other events we were among several presenters, like experts on animal calling, or gun safety, those who help to educate our conservation-minded people and how important raptor are to our ecosystem.
