

Arizona is blessed with many things including millions of acres of public land, unparalleled beauty, a rich history, and at least for now, tied with California for the most National Monuments (NM) in all the states, 18.

The "18" is a fluid number, as the Chiricahua NM is on course to be transformed into a National Park (NP). Bipartisan legislation from our Arizona Congressional delegation is pushing the transition with Senator Kelly on the Senate side, and Representative Ciscomani on the House side.

This type of transition, from NM to NP has happened many times before around the country, as well as in Arizona. The Grand Canyon, Saguaro, Petrified Forest, and Marble Canyon NM's became NP's. (Marble Canyon became part of the Grand Canyon)

When a NM becomes a NP, the rules change. As a piece of land or place moves up the special designation ladder, the bureaucracy increases accordingly too. You can debate the merits either way, however oftentimes the bureaucracy simply creates roadblocks (literally and figuratively), and the managing agency proceeds with more restrictions.

Hence the importance of a NM's Proclamation language. What has the President proclaimed by invoking the Antiquities Act?

President Clinton went on a "monument spree" at the end of his term, particularly in Arizona, naming five new monuments. One is back in the spotlight again, the Sonoran Desert NM; because of what was left out of the proclamation, recreational shooting.

At least dating back to 2012, recreational shooting became a target for incremental elimination across the almost half a million acres. Since then, it has been in the management spotlight, with shrinking availability across the NM. Factor in the courts, and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is now reviewing the issue once again.

"The purpose of the amendment is to establish management guidance for recreational target shooting within the monument and to fulfill the requirements of an April 2022 court settlement."

You may not be a target shooter, and you may even like these potentially enhanced restrictions, but the point is, it's an easier path to challenge a component or activity on a NM when it isn't enshrined in the NM's Proclamation.

Politics are also in play when it comes to NM's. You might think such potential treasures would be above that fray, but alas they are not. Presidents from both parties have proclaimed NM's. Going all the way back to President Nixon, Democrat Presidents have designated 60 NM's and

Republican Presidents 6.

For over 15 years, Representative Grijalva has worked to have additional land set aside and "protected" along the Colorado River, without success until possibly now. The political stars have aligned with support from both of Arizona's Senators, our Governor, and the President. This new NM would be called the Baaj Nwaavjo I'tah Kukveni Grand Canyon National Monument. Here's a press release with some background.

Originally the North Kaibab was going to be included in the NM footprint, however thanks to Senator Sinema, it has been removed from inclusion to date. Without the North Kaibab, the NM would be approximately 1,069,970 acres in size, consisting of current Game Management Units 13A, 12B, and 9.

Senator Sinema's and Rep. Grijalva's staff are currently working on a "marker" bill for consideration by the Congress. The bill won't pass the House, but it will set parameters and guidelines for the President "when" he decides to make this monument proclamation.

Governor Hobbs' wrote the President on May 30, 2023, expressing her support for the proposed monument, but also requested clarification "that the Arizona Game and Fish Department will retain its existing authority related to management, control, and regulation of fish and wildlife so that this authority is clearly delineated prior to the years-long formation of a monument management plan." The Governor's request is important!

AZSFWC has been working with the Arizona Game & Fish Department (AZGFD) and Commission in concert with the Congressional staffers, to ensure AZGFD's statutory responsibility to manage wildlife with all the available tools (including hunting and angling) is specific in the bill's language.

AZSFWC has not yet taken a position on the proposed monument, however the significance of enshrining that specific language in the bill is of utmost importance, particularly when you consider what is under way now with the Sonoran Desert NM.

Our work continues!

The AZSFWC is responsible for managing the conservation license plate program (L. Gary Stinson Grant Fund). The fund is derived from the sale of wildlife conservation license plates and member organizations as well as non-member organizations are eligible to apply for those funds.



By purchasing this plate you will be making a contribution to Arizona's wildlife and wildlife habitat. Seventeen dollars (\$17) of each twenty-five (\$25) special license fee will go to AZSFWC's L. Gary Stinson Grant Fund. AZSFWC will review and approve all grants from the special license plate program revenues. These grants will fund important outdoor recreational and educational opportunities and on-the-ground wildlife habitat restoration and enhancement projects. (More info HERE).

Order your plate as a sequential shelf plate for \$25.00 per year or as a personalized plate for \$50.00 per year.
