#### Arizona Legislation

As of March 1st a total of 1289 Bills had been posted. Of those, 8 had passed both the House and Senate, 6 were signed by Governor Ducey and 1 was vetoed. Finally, 96 Memorials and Resolutions were put forth and 5 of those were passed.

<u>HB 2272</u> This legislation would extend residency privileges in big game draws to the youth dependents of active duty service members who qualify as residents of Arizona. Passed the House 59-1-0. Unanimously passed out of Senate Natural Resources and Energy Committee.

<u>HB 2433</u> Legislation eliminating the word and definition of "trophy" from Game & Fish statute language. Passed the House 44-16-0. Bipartisan support passing out of Senate Natural Resources and Energy Committee.

<u>HB 2271</u> Public Lands Day, designating the first Saturday of April each year as Public Lands Day. Passed the House 60-0-0. Unanimously passed out of Senate Natural Resources and Energy Committee.

<u>HB 2547</u> Public Lands Management Department, establishes the Arizona Department of Public Land Management to provide for public land management by the state. Passed the House 31-29-0. Referred to Senate Natural Resources and Energy Committee.

<u>HCM 2005</u> The Legislature urges the U.S. Congress to decline to designate the Great Bend of the Gila River and the surrounding areas

as a national monument. Passed the House 31-29-0. Passed out of

Senate Natural Resources and Energy Committee.

<u>HCM 2007</u> The Legislature urges the U.S. Congress to act to prohibit federal agencies from recommending and identifying Arizona's public lands as wilderness areas without express congressional consent and state and local support. Passed the House 31-28-1. To be heard in Senate Natural Resources and Energy Committee.

<u>SB 1520</u> Livestock definition; Feral Goats; for the purpose of livestock regulations, the definition of "livestock" is modified to exclude feral goats. Passed the Senate 29-1-0. Sent to the House.

### Congressional Legislation

<u>S.47</u> Lands Package; President Trump signed this bipartisan legislation, which among many things, permanently authorizes the Land and Water Conservation Fund, allows for the LaPaz County Land Conveyance and approves the land exchange between Bullhead City and the Bureau of Reclamation (via the Bureau of Land Management) trading a piece of property in town with over 1000 acres in the Black Mountains.

### Ninth Circuit Ruling

Much of the time "we" aren't enamored by the news out of the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals, but they got one right, with a big win for sportsmen and women here in Arizona! The Ninth Circuit affirmed the District Court's grant of summary judgment to the Forest Service in an action challenging travel management plans implemented by the Forest Service to permit limited motorized big game retrieval in three Ranger Districts of the Kaibab National Forest.

# AZSFWC Approves \$59,137 in Grants

First quarter grant applications were presented and voted on at the February 26th AZSFWC Board meeting. Five grants were approved in the amount of \$59,137 and included the following:

- \$25,000 was awarded to the AZ Antelope Foundation (AAF) for mesquite eradication spot treatment.
- \$1875 was awarded to the AZ Trout Unlimited Council (AZTU) to support their 10th Annual Native & Wild Trout Conference.

- \$20,000 was awarded to the AZ Chapter of NWTF to support AZ Game & Fish Department's Public Outreach Program for Watchable Wildlife.
- \$5,000 was awarded to Tucson Audubon Society for their "Bringing Lucy's Warblers Home" project.
- \$7,262 was awarded to the AZ Chapter of NWTF to support their 2019 Marvin Robbins Youth Turkey Camps.


