

Arizona Sportsmen for Wildlife Conservation

On the ground, so to speak:

- -The Tonto National Forest just closed their comment period as they prepare to plan for management on 3 million acres of one of the most visited National Forests in the country. The last time this was done was in 1985. We weighed in with comments and you <u>click here</u> to see the letter.
- -After almost 7 years the Prescott National Forest finally came to a decision to proceed with reciprocal easements between the Forest and the Yavapai Ranch, which has thousands of acres of checkerboard lands mixed in with the forest lands. This is a win not only for the Prescott NF and the ranch, but for sportsmen and women when it comes to access. We weighed in with comments and you can <u>click</u> here to see the letter.
- -The Kaibab National Forest has had a couple environmental assessments going on which we have supported of late, including two Miller Pipeline extensions and a Wetlands Habitat improvement project.
- -The BLM is currently undertaking a review along the Black Canyon Corridor to do a Travel Management Plan. This study will determine what roads to close, and what roads to leave open. http://bit.ly/2oMhl0C
- -The Department of the Interior is asking for comment on the review of 27 National Monuments over 100,000 acres in size, along with the Antiquities Act that allowed their formation. There are four here in Arizona; Sonoran Desert, Ironwood Forest, Vermillion Cliffs and Grand Canyon-Parashant.

Grant Success!

Pinaleno Ecosystem Restoration Project (PERP Stewardship) Year 4 2016-2017, completed March 15, 2017



Year 4 of the PERP Stewardship Project was more productive relative to past years and progress was made in project sub-unit 301 of Treasure Park A Treatment Unit.

Work on this project is logistically challenging and work was not initiated until November 2016 due

to our primary contractor having issues obtaining Worker's Comp Insurance. Weather caused a few delays as well, but 54.4 acres were treated and 82 loads of biomass (logs) were removed from the project site. Logs were hauled to a sort yard located on Graham County property and stacked.

In January 2017 an interested party was identified who agreed to purchase all logs previously hauled to the sort yard inc luding those currently being hauled. By mid-March only a fe w small, short logs remained and



these will likely be sold locally as fuel wood. All proceeds raised through the sale of logs is returned to the project and used as non-Federal match allowing for additional work to occur.

The funding provided by this grant from AZSFWC, \$40,000, enabled the NWTF to provide non-Federal match for an additional

ARIZONA ANTELOPE FOUNDATION GREER FENCE REMOVAL AND MODIFICATION JUNE 10, 2017

<u>Project Location:</u> We will be working on the Apache National Forest a few miles north of Big Lake in the White Mountains.

<u>Project Begins:</u> Saturday June 10th at 7AM (sunrise is 5:00am!) and possibly Sunday 7-11. Meet at camp for all start times. The campsite is located about five miles east of the project site.

<u>Project Activity:</u> We will be modifying approximately 2 miles of existing low hanging four strand fence by removing the bottom strand of barbed wire and replacing with a single strand of smooth wire at a height of 16 inches.


<u>Pronghorn Benefits:</u> The project is located in a high elevation grassland that is key summer range for pronghom. The proghorn must cross this fence while migrating between this summer range and lower elevation winter range. Improving this fence will also allow more access to the summer range. Retaining the travel connectivity within the summer range is critical to maintaining this population of pronghorn which summer and reproduce near Big Lake. This project is our second annual project to enhance habitat for these migratory pronghorn. Subsequent projects will work up into the primary summer range modifying and or removing livestock fences.

<u>Volunteer Benefits:</u> All volunteer work hours and mileage will be use as in-kind match for federally funded wildlife enhancement projects including the Arizona Game and Fish Habitat Partnership program.

What to Bring: Workgloves (The AAF will have a limited supply), snacks, water, personal gear.

<u>Meals:</u> Please provide your own lunches to eat in the field on the Saturday work days. The AAF will be providing dinners on Friday and Saturday nights and continental breakfasts with coffee and juice on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

<u>Directions to Camp:</u> AAF camp site will be located on the north side of Rudd Knoll, which is about 12 miles south of Highway 260 and 14 miles southwest of Eagar.

Travel 38 miles east of Pinetop on Highway 260; turn right (south) on State Highway 261 at mile post 393 (You can also take Highway 60 east from Show Low to Eagar and turn west onto Highway 260 to reach MP 393.); go about 12 miles south on Highway 261 to mile post 400.5 and turn left (east) at the AAF signs located on the north side of Rudd Knoll. Access until this turnoff is paved road and the camping area starts within a ¼ mile of the highway. Please note this is a public camping area, but efforts will be made to "reserve" a specific AAF camping area.

<u>Project Location:</u> The project site is located approximately 3 miles west of camp. Take Forest Road 409 (FR 409) west from State Route 261 about three miles. FR 409 is located about 1 mile north of camp from Highway 261. Work site is located about ½ mile south of FR 409, and access varies according to the location.

<u>Camping Restrictions:</u> If fire restrictions are in place then no open fires will be allowed. This includes the use of charcoal. Cooking will be restricted to propane stoves.


Cost: Registration is \$50 per day and "Class" and "Lewis" options will be available.

AZSFWC will review and approve all grants from the special license plate program revenues. These grants will fund important outdoor recreational and educational opportunities and on-the-ground wildlife habitat restoration and enhancement projects.

The fund is derived from the sale of wildlife conservation license plates and member organizations as well as non-member organizations are eligible to apply for those funds.
