





Summarize Project Accomplishments:

This past year (2023) we twice recruited, oriented, developed community with, provided gear for, and transported 30 young women (15 each session) from diverse communities in Tucson and Phoenix, to Prescott, AZ to attend 3-day Becoming an Outdoors-Woman (BOW) workshops in April and September. Each participant took 4 different outdoor skills classes during the weekend.

All combined, participants attended over 100 outdoor related classes including warm-water fishing, field dressing, rappelling, firearm safety, basic handgun, rifle shooting, fly fishing, water safety, kayaking & canoeing, Dutch-oven cooking, sausage making, bird watching, and beginning bowhunting.

As a result of their having attended BOW and thereby developing a passion for a newly discovered outdoor activity, two B2B participants (one from the April 20223 BOW and one from Sept. 2022 BOW) became Apprentice Instructors at the Sept. 2023 BOW workshop. Both women will continue working towards becoming full instructors, one teaching archery and the other teaching rappelling.

Nineteen (19) B2B participants attended post-BOW camping and conservation weekend workshops, utilizing their new sleeping bags and headlamps, as well as their newly gained confidence and skills in dispersed camping activities. During these campouts, they also worked with Forest Service personnel to learn and apply new conservation skills including cross-cut saw usage, trail building, and planting of native species. While these were not covered in this grant, attendance was a direct result of women having participated in B2B which has led to them wanting to become more involved in outdoor activities, including conservation projects. Additionally the majority of B2B women have stated interested in learning how to hunt (including archery hunting).






