## RE: ADOT & AZGFD Grant Request from the Wildlife Crossings Pilot Program for the Kachina Village Overpass Project, FY2024-2025

Arizona Sportsmen for Wildlife Conservation (AZSFWC) appreciates the opportunity to lend support for the grant application of the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) and the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD) to the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA) Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Wildlife Crossings Pilot Program (WCPP).

AZSFWC is the leading 501c-3 non-profit organization dedicated to wildlife conservation, habitat improvement, youth recruitment and retention, as well as providing educational opportunities for outdoor enthusiasts on issues important to their passions. AZSFWC member, affiliate, and associate groups reach across the spectrum of wildlife conservation, angling, hunting, shooting, outdoor recreation, and businesses from across Arizona. Our member groups represent well over 28,500 people from Arizona.

ADOT is requesting approximately \$25 million in WCPP funding to complete the final design and construction of the proposed Kachina Village Overpass Project along Interstate-17 (I-17) south of the City of Flagstaff. I-17 is one of Arizona's major connecting corridors. The wildlife crossing will be used by elk and many other species that cross the highway. It will also include nearly 13 miles of fencing, cattle guards, and concrete escape ramps.

Along this stretch of I-17, wildlife-vehicle collisions (WVCs) account for the highest percentage of all crash causes (>20%), with some one-mile segments exceeding 30%. This greatly surpasses the 4.6% National average for WVCs on rural highways.

Construction of this wildlife crossing and fencing along the corridor will not only reduce the number of WVCs but will also enhance habitat connectivity that is currently limited by the barrier I-17 created preventing safe wildlife movement.

ADOT's previous experience with grade-separated wildlife crossings has clearly demonstrated these projects are effective in reducing WVCs by 90-100% as well as promoting permeability across the highway. This project is adjacent (approximately 5.6 miles) to and complements the recently awarded FHWA 2023 WCPP Willard Springs Overpass Project which AZSFWC also supported.

AZSFWC Support for ADOT-AZGFD Kachina Village Overpass Project Grant – 8-16-24

Arizona's wildlife will benefit with safe passage across this heavily used highway, as well as increase habitat connectivity too. At the same time, motorists along I-17 will have a safer journey with the anticipated reduction in WVCs.

AZSFWC and 30 of our organizations (list attached) strongly support this project and the funding request.
