However hundreds and even thousands more people outside will create pressure on the resources and infrastructure.

Firearms sales went through the roof, and as you might imagine, so did ammunition sales. It will take some time for availability of both to settle down to whatever is going to be the new "normal". In the meantime Pittman-Robertson money will be on solid ground for the foreseeable future.

There will be a couple key issues we'll need to concentrate on in the future:

- 1. Reeducating folks on the importance of "conservation" in the outdoors, and
- 2. Reinforcing the importance of "ethics" in the outdoors to sportsmen and women, even the experienced ones.

The continuing changes in Arizona's population dynamics will elevate the importance of these two matters going forward.

With that, here's hoping the new year is not only happy, but healthy for all of us!



Sales of our specialty license plate (see purchasing info below) provide funding to AZSFWC's Wildlife Conservation Fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide grants for habitat projects

that are deemed beneficial for all species of wildlife in Arizona. It is also available to help fund hunting and angling recruitment and/or retention activities or wildlife conservation education events or programs.

Any 501c3 within Arizona can apply for project or event funding as long as they are in good standing with the Arizona Corporation Commission. Applications for project funding must be submitted in writing on forms provided by the AZSFWC. This past summer the AZSFWC grant program provided funding to the AZ Chapter of the Mule Deer Foundation to repair an important wildlife water. Lennox Trick Tank is a Forest Service wildlife drinker that is located in Unit 7 East on the Coconino National Forest. This catchment had a new apron constructed to efficiently catch rain water and store in the 3,500 gallon storage tank. 

Seventeen dollars (\$17) of each twenty-five (\$25) special license fee will go to AZSFWC's conservation fund. AZSFWC will review and approve all grants from the special license plate program revenues. These grants will fund important outdoor recreational and educational opportunities and on-the-ground wildlife habitat restoration and enhancement projects. (More info HERE).

Arizona Sportsmen for Wildlife Conservation is a 501-c-3 not-for-profit organization whose mission is to educate and inform sportsmen, wildlife conservation organizations throughout the state and the public at large on important issues related to wildlife and wildlife habitat and to provide, via grants or other sources, funding to conserve Arizona's wildlife populations through habitat enhancement initiatives. The AZSFWC is responsible for managing the conservation license plate program (Wildlife Conservation Habitat Fund). The fund is derived from the sale of wildlife conservation license plates and member organizations as well as non-member organizations are eligible to apply for those funds.
