Finally, some other news:

The Grand Canyon National Park bison culling effort is moving forward, which is a good thing, notwithstanding it has taken years to get to this point.

The National Park Service has now selected 25 volunteers from almost 47,000 applicants, of which 12 will participate.

USFWS is continuing with National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) hunting and angling expansion on the Havasu and Bill Williams refuges. This follows in the footsteps of the expansion that began in 2020, with Buenos Aries, Cabeza Prieta, Cibola and Leslie Canyon. AZSFWC supported this effort last year and will again with this round. The comment deadline is July 1<sup>st</sup>.
